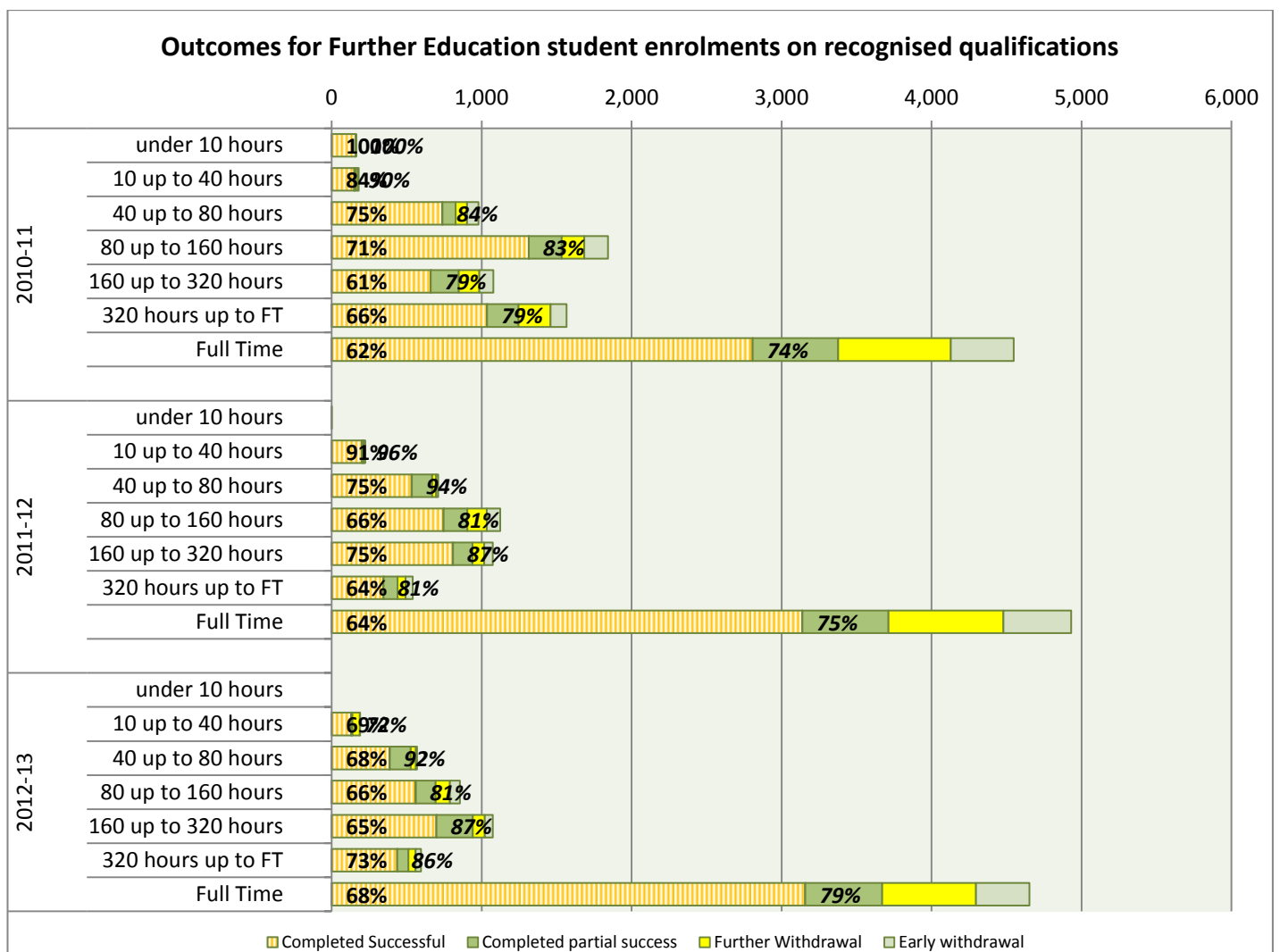


Performance Indicators, 2012-13

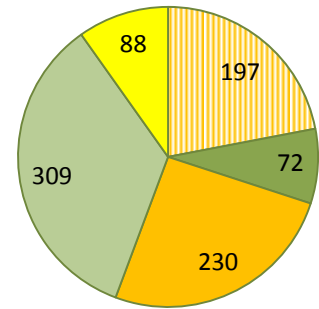

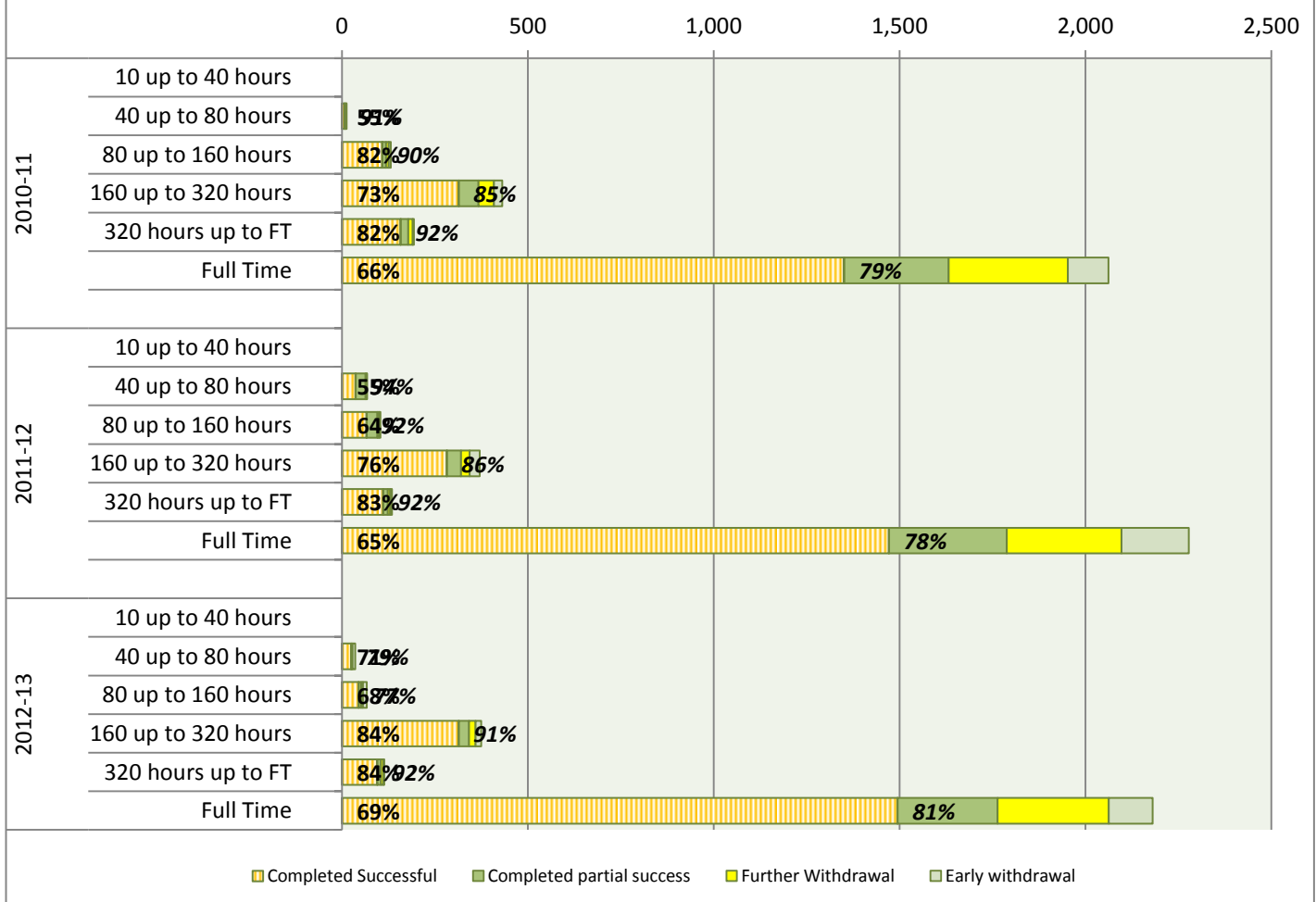
Level of achievement for those students completing their FE course with partial success

- Number of students completing their course achieving at least 75% of planned units



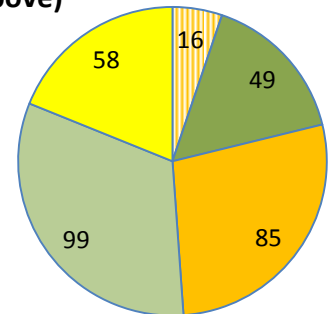
Outcomes for Higher Education student enrolments on recognised qualifications



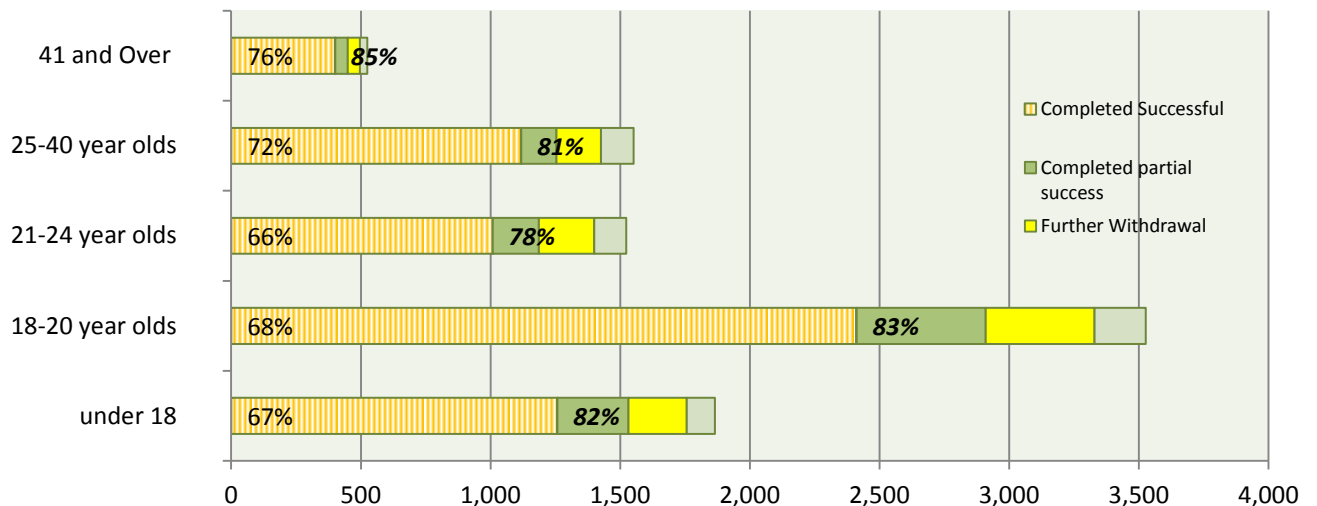
Level of achievement for those students completing their HE course with partial success

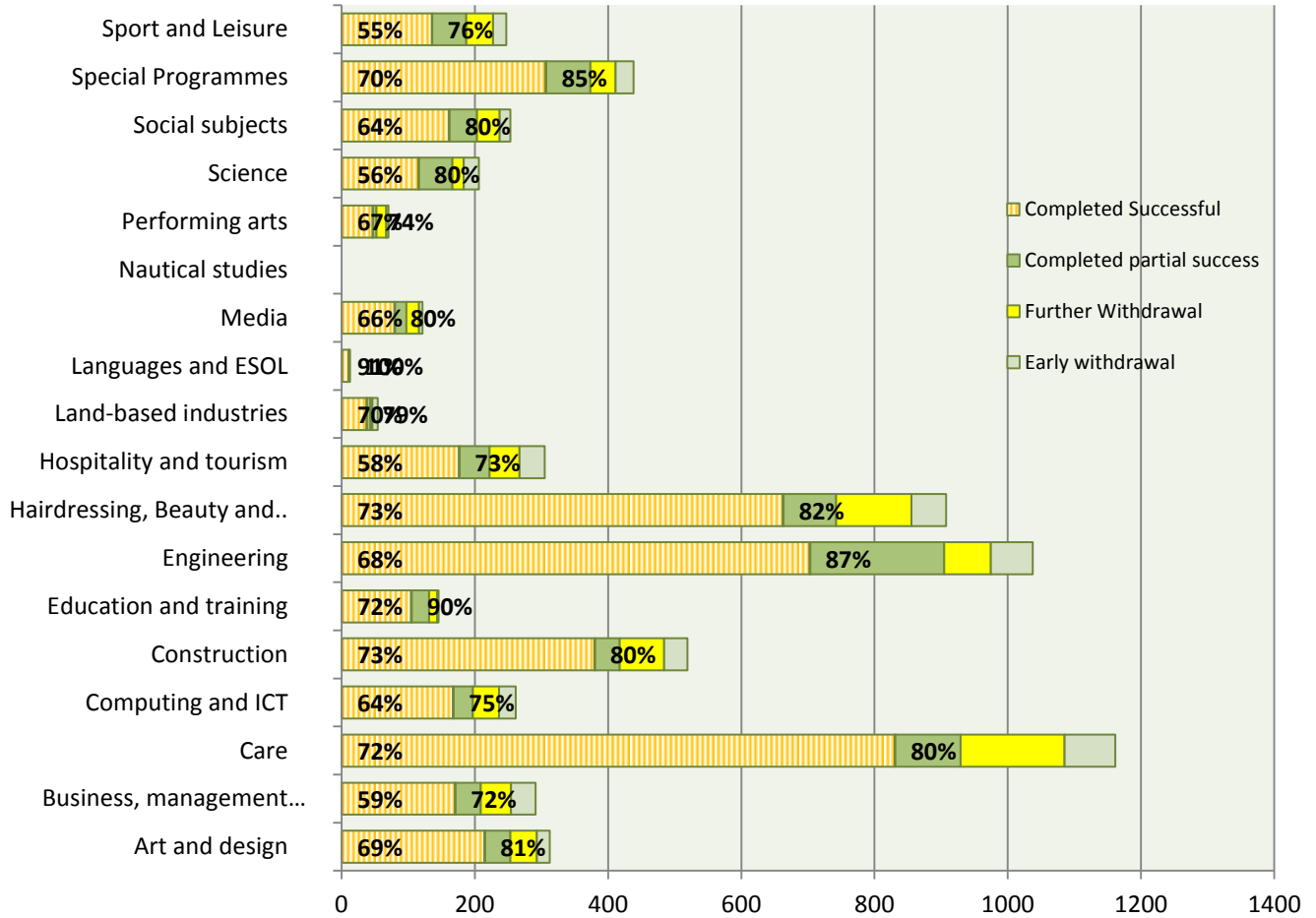
- Number of students who complete their course without gaining any units / credits

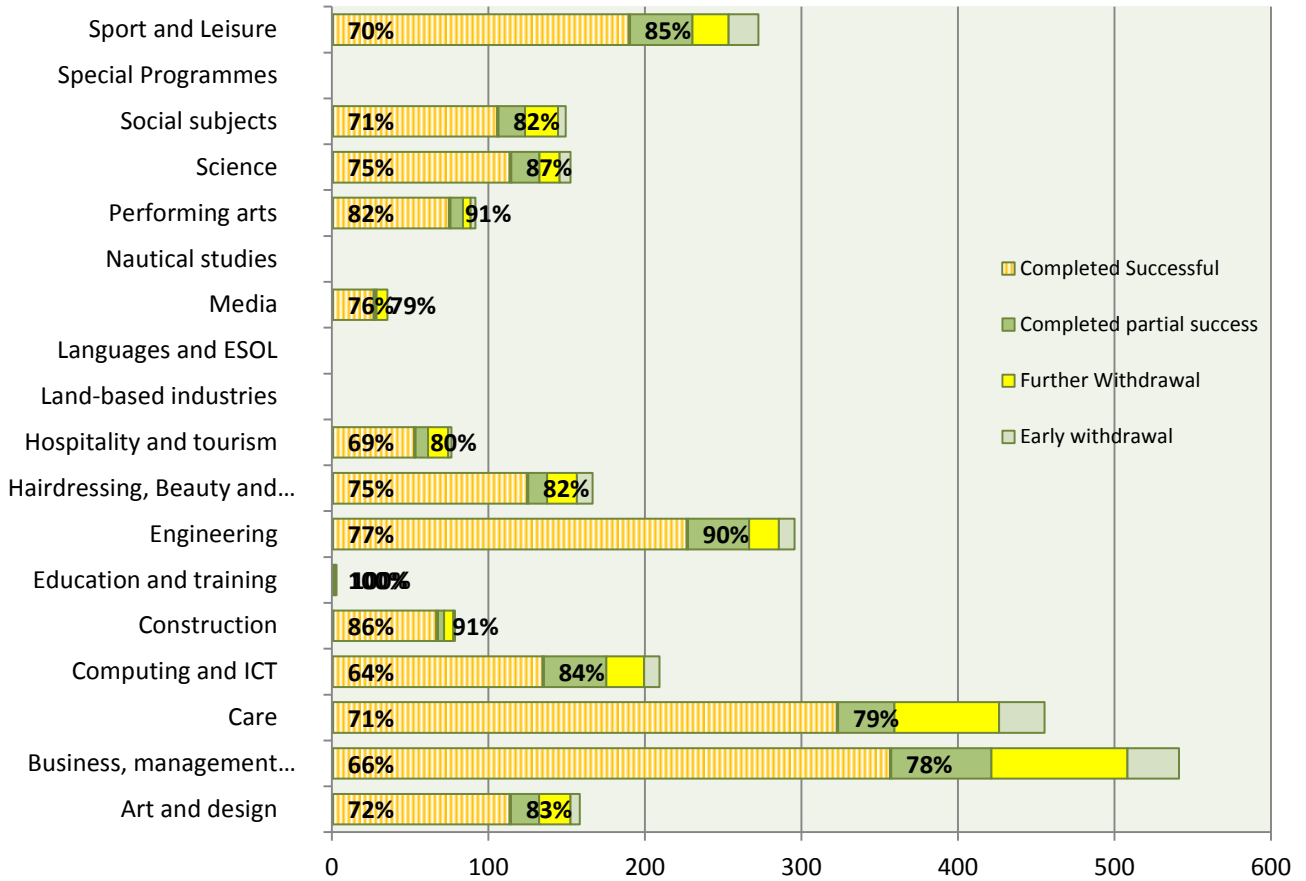
Enrolments by age group for courses lasting 160 hours or more 2012-13



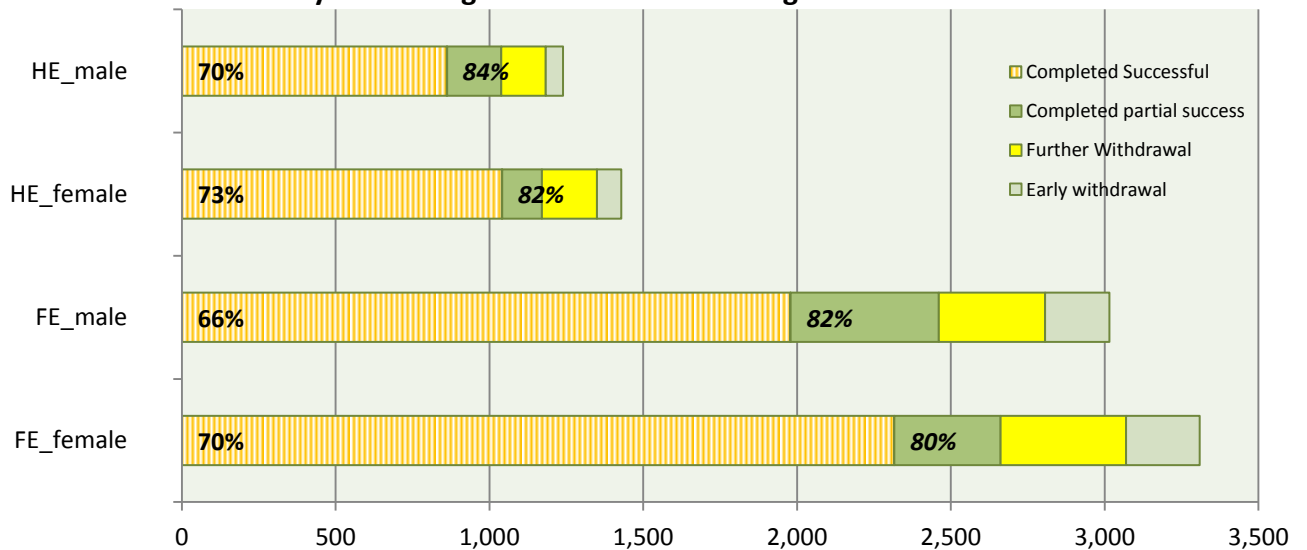
Enrolments by HMIE subject groupings on FE courses lasting for 160 hours or more 2012-13



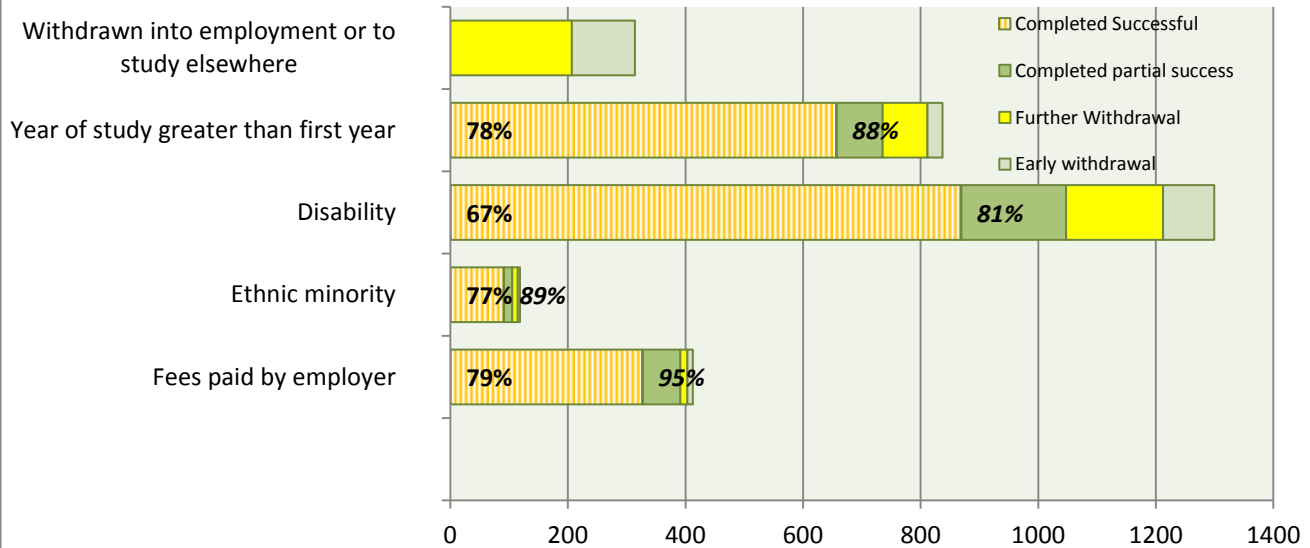
Enrolments by HMIE subject groupings on HE courses lasting for 160 hours or more 2012-13



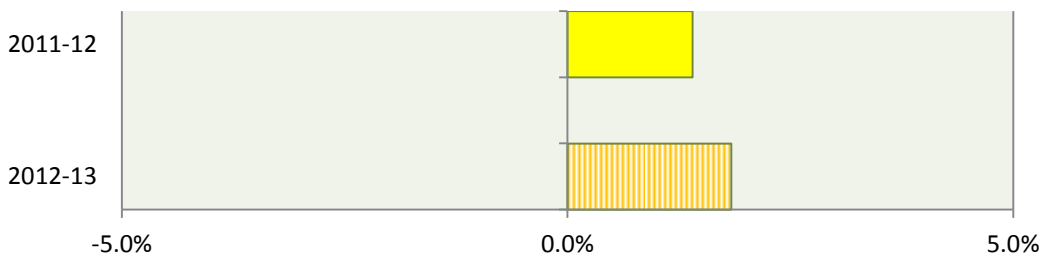
Enrolments by level and gender on courses lasting 160 hours or more 2012-13



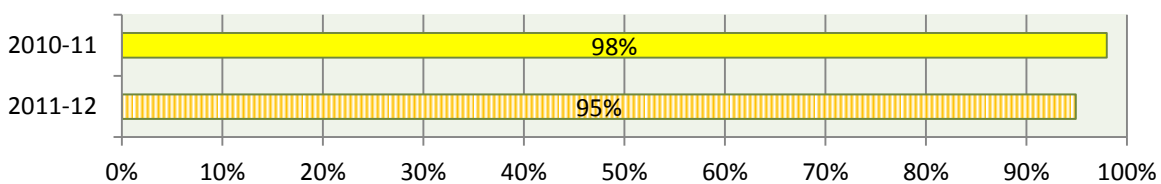
Enrolments by key groups for courses lasting 160 hours or more 2012-13
