

Ayrshire College COVID19 Health & Safety changes and measures

College campuses:

- We have dedicated traffic routes to maintain social distancing with clear markings throughout the buildings, including specific entry and exit points to each college campus.
- A one-way system
- A keep left system
- Sanitisation stations throughout each building of each campus
- Restricted access and occupancy of toilet facilities
- The closure of all non-essential areas including the LRCs, refectory space and access to catering facilities.
- The college has been deep cleaned and has ongoing sanitising teams on patrol through the day.
- Face coverings or masks are mandatory when moving through public areas of the buildings where social distancing is not achievable (as per government guidelines).
- All people attending the college are to bring their own face covering or mask.
- An assessment of risk to all building users has been conducted. This is a fluid document is being reviewed on an ongoing basis.
- Curriculum timetabling has been altered to accommodate social distancing using the two meter rule in all the classrooms.
- Lecturer will conduct candidate temperature checks upon candidates entering the room. Any candidate displaying a temperature of 37.8 °C or greater will be requested to leave the training facility.

Rooms:

- Self-sanitising kit in all the rooms.
- Seats distanced 2 meters apart
- Maximum numbers of people noted on each individual room

Test & Protect:

- Test & Protect, should this information be required as per government guidelines, is conducted via course attendance sheets and gathered from the details completed on college enrolment form.

Lunches:

- Currently the college Refectory is not open and as a result, we suggest bringing in lunch from home, or alternatively there are a range of food provisions within a 5 min walk from college campuses.
- Candidates can eat their lunch in the room the training is conducted, unless a designated location is provided on the day.

Suspected cases:

- Advised not to come into the college if experiencing symptoms of a suspected COVID infection.
- If on campus and you experience symptoms of a suspected COVID infection, please inform the trainer on your course and leave the training environment immediately.
