10 golden rules for receiving funding:

- You must first return your acceptance for Bursary and/or EMA via email to the Student Funding Team
- You must notify the Student Funding Team of any changes to your personal circumstances
- You must notify the Student Funding Team of any changes to your bank account
- You must ensure the Student Funding Team have your current mobile number and email address to allow us to text/email important updates
- You must continue to satisfactorily engage on your course
- You must notify your curriculum area when you are going to be absent
- You must ensure you are of good conduct and treat other students and staff with respect
- You must work to the best of your ability and continue to progress within your chosen course
- You are advised to monitor your attendance and engagement record regularly online even if you know you have not been absent
- You must submit your self-certificates on return to college and within 2 weeks of any absence
