





Ayrshire College - Student Carers Action Plan 2019-2021

Introduction

The Carers (Scotland) Act 2016 came into effect on 1st April 2018.¹ The Act extends and enhances the rights of carers. The legislation helps ensure better and more consistent support for both adult carers and young carers. Education and training for carers is one of the areas included under part 6 of the Act.

As of August 2018, there are an estimated 788,000 people in Scotland who have caring responsibilities. This includes 44,000 who are under the age of 18.

Ayrshire College aims to provide an inclusive learning environment that is responsive to the needs of all students. We recognise that many of our students have to deal with the demands of caring for a friend or relative whilst studying, and we are committed to removing barriers to learning for students who have caring responsibilities.

This Action Plan outlines the steps we will take from AY 2019-20 to AY 2020-21 to improve how we identify, support and report on the achievements of Student Carers at Ayrshire College.
